Helping with e-safety in the community

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Community Challenge is to develop learners' skills, whilst encouraging learners to identify, develop and participate in opportunities that will benefit a community. During the Community Challenge learners will explicitly develop skills of **Planning and Organisation** and **Personal Effectiveness** and apply them in an appropriate manner.

BRIEF

Digital Communities Wales is a Welsh Government digital inclusion programme delivered by the Wales Co-operative Centre. The aim of the **Digital Communities Wales** Community Challenge is to encourage young people who are digital natives and comfortable with the use of technology, to pass on their skills to support and encourage others to use technology in a safe and secure way.



As an individual or a member of a team (3-6 members), to complete this Challenge:

- you will undertake '**Digital Heroes**' training to support the delivery of your community activity. This will develop your support skills to help others understand the importance of **e-safety**, develop effective communication skills and help you understand health and safety procedures and complete risk assessment where relevant.
- once you've undertaken the training, you will identify opportunities to deliver digital sessions that will develop the understanding of **e-safety** with your target audience.
- you will spend a minimum of **2 hours** planning and developing **e-safety** sessions to meet the needs of your target audience. Resources will be made available to you through the **Digital Communities Wales** website.
- you will spend a minimum of **8 hours** working and communicating with others in your community on how to be online safely and securely to real purpose.
