Snowdonia National Park, in their quest for supporting sustainable tourism, are developing briefs to encourage learners to become involved in the amazing resource that is the Snowdonia National Park, and provide valuable information and insight for the organisation so they can balance protecting the area and meeting the needs of *'different communities and people who live, work and visit here'*.

The organisation has launched a key document; The Snowdonia National Park Plan 2020 and is keen to consult with as many stakeholders as possible, including those undertaking the Skills Challenge Certificate through the development of their new Challenge Brief.



Meanwhile, staff at Ysgol Uwchradd Caergybi and Bangor University, inspired by their involvement in the climate change event, Climathon (<https://climathon.climate-kic.org/en/>) are developing a project and linked briefs as part of 'Undeb Môn'. The project looks to raise awareness of the issues behind climate changes and, more importantly, how young people can become part of the solution.

The project will support teaching and learning of the Advanced Skills Challenge Certificate and provide a selection of briefs that Anglesey schools (and anyone else inspired) can use as part of their assessment. Already, schools on the island have met and seem keen to find out more.
