#### Summer 2024 Nea Exemplars

Following the release of Exemplar marked NEAs in 2023, for the purpose of supporting teachers when assessing candidates' NEA work, standardising and benchmarking we will again be releasing some additional Exemplar NEAs from Summer 2024 to continue this support.

This will be available on the <u>Portal</u>. We cannot be sure that every page, design sheet, sketchbook page, model etc has been photographed but the exemplar will provide guidance on the standard that the candidates were working at to obtain that grade.

**Note:** we may not be able to cover all grades within each **focus area** but will do our best to cover as much as possible including Welsh language exemplars (but please be aware that there will be limited availability due to small entry numbers in some focus areas through the medium of Welsh).

This information will be available shortly after the deadline for reviews of moderation. Centres are reminded that these are for reference only, and future candidates should **NOT** be encouraged to closely follow or copy any content.

#### **Question Bank**

Question Bank is a free tool which allows you to create practice question papers. Find the questions you need, add them to your paper and export your paper with accompanying mark scheme and examiner's comments as a PDF ready to use in the classroom.

**Create** - Build your own exam paper.

**Customise** - Mix and match questions across a range of years and topics. **Revise** - Question Bank is suitable for end-of-lesson tests, revision activities or homework.

**Note:** WJEC are currently creating a new and improved Question Bank which will offer users greater functionality until then we hope you will find this tool useful.

#### Online Exam Reviews (OERs)

This year, the OER will take a slightly different format which will hopefully be easier to access and used more by teachers and students. Principal Examiners will provide a detailed commentary for a high, mid and lower achieving examination paper, explaining why specific marks were awarded for responses in the exemplar papers.

Centres should consider the OER resource alongside the Principal Examiner's Report in order to fully appreciate the strengths and weaknesses identified in this summer's paper, in order to reinforce examination preparation to prevent a similar repeat next year.

Centre and whole entry Item Level Data would also be a useful resource to analyse alongside the OER and PE Report to illustrate how questions performed and how all candidates and individual centres accessed marks available.

# 2025 Nea Internal Assessment And Moderation Dates

The deadline dates for marks to be entered via (<u>Portal</u>) IAMIS in 2025 is 5<sup>th</sup> May. (GCSE) and 15th May (GCE).

The moderation windows for centre visits in 2025 are 12<sup>th</sup> - 16<sup>th</sup> May (GCSE) and 19<sup>th</sup> - 23<sup>rd</sup> May (GCE). Moderators will contact your centres (via Exams Officers) in early April to finalise a visit date to moderate your NEAwork.
