

# WJEC GCE English Literature Resource Guide

This booklet provides an overview of the support, guidance, and resources available to those teaching the WJEC GCE English Literature specification across our suite of websites.

### Subject webpage

The WJEC GCE English Literature subject webpage on the WJEC website is the starting place for anyone teaching the specification. It contains a range of official documentation relating to the qualification including the specification, sample assessment materials and past papers.

### **Online Exam Review**

The Online Exam Review website hosts marked examination exemplar in an interactive digital format.

#### **Portal**

<u>Portal</u> is a secure area for centres to access resources. These include past papers and marking schemes (ahead of their publication on the public website), as well as access to CPD materials.

For teachers to access Portal, they will need a username and password. This will be set up by their Examinations Officer.



### Past papers on Portal (shortly after end of exam series)

Past papers are published initially on Portal shortly after the end of the examination series.


### Marking schemes on Portal (from Results Day)

Marking schemes are published initially on Portal on Results Day for the examination series.

To locate the marking schemes, select 'Past Papers & Marking Schemes' from the 'Resources' menu on the left-hand side of the screen:



Then use the dropdown menus to choose the marking schemes that you are looking for:




#### Marking schemes on public website (up to twelve months after Results Day)

Marking schemes are published on the public website around twelve months after results for a series have been issued:



The Principal Examiners' reports provide essential observations and commentary on candidates' performance across the examined series.


They are published on Results Day for each series and are available on the <u>subject webpage</u> under <u>Key Documents > Examiners' Reports.</u>


Until Summer 2022, a set of Online Exam Review material for each exam component was published. These materials, which are still available online, include both clean and marked exemplars of candidate responses to key questions from previous examinations.

The OER materials can be used with students, to encourage them to review others' responses and discuss ways in which they may be improved, thus developing their own skills.

If you are accessing the OER document in a web browser and are only able to see a single page, please download the document and reopen it in Adobe Reader to fully access the material.








### 6. Newsletters




## 7. CPD/ Professional Learning Materials





The aim of this resource is to develop the skills required in reading and analysing prose. It considers ways in which contextual detail and other readings can be integrated into close analysis of texts.






A level Unit 1, Section A: A Close Analysis of Prose Fiction - Blended





Grade boundaries from past examination series are available on the subject webpage.




Grade boundaries are the minimum number of marks needed to achieve each grade.


If you click on 'Grade Boundaries' this will take you to <u>administration > Results, Grade</u> Boundaries and PRS.



Grade boundary information is available for every unit. Make sure you select the correct information from the drop down.



#### **Exam Results Analysis**



Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.

It can be accessed on <u>Portal</u>, and allows you to compare your students' performance on each question with that of the candidature overall, letting you see where they have done well and where there might be room for improvement. To do this, under the 'Results' tab, click on 'View/Print Item Level Data' or 'View/Print Centre Performance' for comparable data.


